### New Windsor weighs electric charging stations

The discussion of electric car charging stations came before the New Windsor Planning Board on Wednesday, August 10. Proposed electric car charging stations would be located at the Amazon facility

located at 500 Hudson Valley Avenue and at the Forge Hill Apartments at 366 Old Forge Hill Road. For clarification, the proposed Amazon car charging stations would be for their own fleet of vehicles.

The only outstanding concern from the discussion would be the designation of spots for electric vehicles

### City to seek grant for art installations

The Newburgh Arts and Cultural Commission [NACC] met on Monday, August 15 to discuss a National Endowment for the Arts [NEA] grant for the anticipated work on several proposed art installations in the City of Newburgh.

The City has applied for a NEA grant to fund an Art Bridge/Arte Puente project, and the listed amount for the grant is \$50,000. Project managers for Art Bridge/Arte Puente are Naomi Hersson-Ringskog and Kaja Kuehl who NACC members have been in contact with on the project.

Three installations that are being proposed for the city are a mural on the side of the DMU Building facing the parking lot, another would be a temporary sculpture installation at 136

### Scenic Hudson hosts forum on Danskammer proposal

Residents of the greater Newburgh area joined together at the Newburgh Free Library on Thursday, August 11 for a community discussion on the proposed Danskammer fracked gas plant. The Danskammer Plant currently rests along the Hudson River in the Town of Newburgh.

Members of the community listened and asked questions to Hayley Carlock, Director of Environmental Advocacy and Legal Affairs for Scenic Hudson and Maddie Feaster, Outreach Organizer for Scenic Hudson, who led

### Democratic Primary is August 23

Early voting has already begun for the Orange County Democratic Primary that will take place on Tuesday, August 23 to choose a candidate for the November congressional election.

Democrats Pat Ryan, Moses R. Mugulusi and Aisha Mills appear on the ballot. The winner will face Assemblyman Colin Schmitt (R-C- New Windsor) in November to represent the 18th congressional district in Washington.

Mugulusi did not respond to requests for information about his candidacy prior to deadline. The other candidates are profiled here.

#### Pat Ryan

Ulster County Executive Pat Ryan is running in two races on August 23. In addition to the primary, he is also a candidate in a special election to replace newly-appointed Lt. Governor Antonio Delgado in the 19th Congressional District that presently includes Ulster County. The congressional district boundaries will be re-drawn in January, and with new 18th district will include all of Orange and Ulster Counties.

Ryan is currently serving as the Ulster County Executive, a position he has held since 2019. He is a fifthgeneration Ulster County resident, and after graduating from Kingston High School he attended West Point and later served two tours of duty in Iraq as an Army Intelligence Officer. After leaving the military, he founded a small technology company in the county, which he grew to more than 150 employees. Pat lives in Gardiner with his wife, Rebecca and their two sons, Theo and Cameron.

Ryan has made defending a woman's right to choose a focus of his campaign, with his signs pointing out that 'choice is on the ballot.' He has promised to work to pass common sense gun policies to protect children; make investments in the district's communities by expanding broadband and by lowering housing costs; suspend the gas tax; hold corporations accountable for price gouging and is willing to take on corporate polluters in order to protect our water and clean air.

Ryan said we need to invest in our roads and bridges, expand rail, help workers with training and technology so they can compete for good jobs,

revitalize small businesses by reducing regulatory burdens while improving access to capital, ensure that equal work means equal pay regardless of gender and move forward to expand equal rights for LGBTQ communities especially in healthcare, housing, employment and education. He promises to embrace clean energy alternatives to help reduce our dependence on fossil fuels while creating good jobs in the district. He firmly believes that in the process we should end subsidies to fossil fuel companies.

Ryan said the economy is not favoring the working class and blames corporations for helping themselves to more than their fair share. He would work toward a 'peoplecentered' economy that provides child care, affordable housing and more investment in the district's infrastructure.

#### Aisha Mills

Described on her campaign website as a journalist and advocate, Mills moved to Newburgh with her partner Melanie Collins and their three children after having spent over 20 years in Washington helping to advance progressive federal policies and elect hundreds of women, people of color, and LGBTQ leaders to every level of government. She has also appeared on television as a political analyst on CNN and MSNBC.

"Politics are deeply personal for me," Mills said. "As a Black lesbian,

raised in a working-class family by grandparents who left South Carolina in the 1950s to flee Jim Crow, I know the sting of systemic discrimination. I am running because we deserve a bold leader who will leverage every piece of legislation, every policy platform, and every public forum possible to beat back bigotry, protect our rights, and strengthen our democracy so that the government actually works for all of us."

In her campaign platform, Mills pledges to restore and protect womens' rights and voting rights: to codify equality for all into the law; work to ensure economic security, affordable housing, and healthcare for all—especially for our seniors and kids with a quality education from pre-K through college, without saddling them with massive debt.

"We can and will win, IF we elect leaders with the political will and the experience to get things done in Washington, as I have," Mills said.

Polls will be open from 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. on Election Day. Early voting began August 13 and will continue through August 21. Locations include the City of Newburgh Activity Center, 401 Washington Street, Newburgh at the following times: Wednesday, August 17, noon to 8 p.m.; Thursday, August 18, Saturday, August 20 and Sunday, August 21 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Friday, August 19, 7 a.m. to 3 p.m.

### Fit Camp launched at Delano-Hitch Park

On the morning of Saturday, August 6, under the hot sun, Ivette Duran hosted her weekly Fit Camp sessions on the newly opened outdoor fitness court at Delano-Hitch Park in the City of Newburgh.

The new outdoor fitness court, located behind the city recreation department offices, officially opened to the public on Thursday, July 7 with a formal ribbon cutting. Back in October 2021, Senator James Skoufis and Assemblyman Jonathan Jacobson had hosted a joint press conference and each official pledged \$50,000 each towards the construction. In addition, the National Fitness Campaign [NFC] pledged \$30,000 was pledged by the NFC towards the court construction.

The outdoor fitness court concept and current design was created by the NFC and is a seven usage outdoor fitness circuit that offers workouts for your core, your agility and helps work out other muscle groups and parts of the body. Equipment for lunges and squats,

pull-ups bars, push-up bars and other workouts are available. The fitness court, like the one now in Newburgh, is one of many across the country on college campuses and in city parks and neighborhoods. A Fitness Court App is available for download so residents and visitors can have access to a free digital workout library.

Though Duran had recently discovered the fitness court, it has

helped in her training program and she is grateful to have the space available here. "There's no better feeling than an accomplished workout," Duran said. "I feel great."

Friend Tiffany Paul who took part in the fit camp shared that she felt awesome and was thankful to have this free and accessible workout space. Paul highlighted that parents can bring kids to the fitness court so while kids enjoy the outdoors, parents can workout. "I think it's awesome that the community can come out and work out on their healthcare goals, their fitness goals and it [the fitness court] is available to the community, in the community," Paul said "Let's change the narrative. Newburgh and the surrounding areas, great things can come out of this community and it does come out of this community. The fact that Newburgh brought this into the community is forward movement."

Several of these fit camps have been hosted at the fitness court and other workout locations, all the while still being free and accessible to anyone who wants to join. Duran encourages any who are looking to start their health journey or look to be a part of a growing workout community to connect with her on Instagram @ lamore8 and flyers for her camp are also available at the Newburgh Armory Unity Center.

in the living complex. If there are no residents who own electric vehicles, then that can create some difficulty for parking.

The electric vehicle market has incorporated many notable brands to release their own brand and line of vehicles whereas one of the most recognized brands is the company Tesla that mainly manufactures electric vehicles. The most notable car charging stations in the immediate area for electric vehicle drivers are the Tesla stations located in the Cosimo's parking lot and the universal charging stations located in the Wal-Mart parking lot along Route 300. This universal charging station allows various electric vehicles from other brands to get the required charge they need for their trip. In the Town of Newburgh, charging stations were proposed behind several commercial storefronts at The Shoppes at Union Square for a company known as Rivian.

In a report from Electrek, it shared that within the first quarter of 2022, there were over 200,000 sales of

electric vehicles nationally. Since 2011, national sales for electric vehicles have increased to over 2.6 million. In the state of California, where the most known electric car company company Tesla was founded, it was recorded that 1.1 million electric vehicles have been sold since 2011 whereas in the first quarter of 2022, over 81,000 electric vehicles have been sold.

Referring back to Rivian, the company currently offers two vehicle models on their website that are available for purchase. According to their website, the R1T model, a truck, is currently listed at \$67,500 and the R1S model, an suv, is currently listed at \$72,000. According to the Tesla website, the Tesla Model 3 is currently listed at \$46,990, compared to the Model X Plaid, at a value of \$138,990.

In the immediate Newburgh/New Windsor area, there are several public charging stations available for usage and there are several car dealerships along the 17K corridor. While these

brands have their own electric vehicle line for purchase, there do not seem to be many electric vehicles for purchase at these specific locations.

Thruway Nissan has had no electric cars in their immediate stock for the past year but they do house two charging stations at their site. Morehead Honda also does not have electric vehicles in stock.

Hudson Valley Chrysler Dodge Jeep Ram stated that there have been no electric vehicles in stock at the dealership and only offer one hybrid vehicle. Sunshine Ford confirmed that though there were no electric vehicles in stock at the dealership, the dealership site does have two charging stations for usage. The representative also shared that since 2019, the dealership has sold 20 electric vehicles.

Colandrea Buick-GMC, Inc. confirmed that the only electric vehicle that they carried thus far has been a hummer, which is projected around \$118,000 - \$120,000, and reservations must be placed in order to be able to purchase. Reservation orders can take about a year. Healey Kia was in the process of conducting research and Unity Chevrolet of Newburgh was not available at the immediate time.

the discussion during the course of the evening.

This event was co-sponsored by Orange RAPP, Riverkeeper, Hudson River Sloop Clearwater Inc, the Newburgh Clean Water Project, Communities for Local Power and the Sierra Club.

"In 1885, it [the Dankskammer site] was built up, a lighthouse was built, Danskammer Point Lighthouse and then in 1951, that's when Central Hudson took over and they built the coal powered generating stations. That lasted for about 50 years," Feaster said. "2001, it was sold to Dynegy, another energy generating corporation as part of energy deregulation. But they only had it till about 2012."

During 2012, Hurricane Sandy hit New York State and flooded out the plant. Two years later, Danskammer reopened as a natural gas peaker plant under the ownership of Mercuria Energy. Four years later, Danskammer Energy LLC, the current owners of the site, pursued to build a larger facility that would operate nonstop.

The current gas plant, according to Carlock, is known as a peaker plant, which means that it addresses peak demand periods and does not operate all the time. The facility currently still operates as a natural gas fired plant and the proposed Danskammer fracked gas plant would look to operate nonstop if built.

When the plant expansion was first announced in 2019, the Stop Danskammer Coalition, a non-partisan alliance of local and regional elected officials, community groups, residents, business owners, stakeholders and other individuals, was formed in opposition to the announcement.

"The new one is proposed to run so much more

often. In Danskammer's own filings with the New York State Siting Board, they clearly state that they expect there'll be more air pollution coming from the new plant," Carlock said. "Every time you're adding any pollution source - and natural gas plants are very much a pollution source that is known to cause respiratory issues in surrounding areas, like the City of Newburgh - this is only going to exacerbate these problems."

In October of 2021, it was reported that the New York State Department of Environmental Conversation [NYSDEC] denied Danskammer's Title V air permit for a fracked gas power plant.

A few months later in December of 2021, Danskammer appealed the NYSDEC's decision on their air permit. From there, Danskammer requested a hearing on the denial of the air permit.

The following year in June 2022, the Orange County Supreme Court had rejected Danskammer's effort to overturn the denial of its permit under new climate law; and now into the summer of 2022, the public opposition has remained strong while the formal decision process is currently underway.

While the coalition has been able to celebrate these victories, labor unions are in support of the building as it would lead to more job opportunities. One major supporter that Carlock identified was the New York State Building & Construction Trades Council.

Carlock presented several alternative concepts to the group for the Danskammer site that included energy storage facilities, public parks and sites, boat launching sites and possible waterfront development. This presentation has come before Danskammer Energy LLC, who did not appear to be interested according to Carlock.

Broadway, the vacant lot next to the DMV and



finally, there would be 10 banners placed along light poles in the city. The location was mentioned to be South St. but would need further clarification.

Over the course of the next hour, the NACC members deliberated and discussed the project and work related to it as well as the acceptance of the grant, which raised more questions than answers.

NACC members felt that they needed more information and clarification on the grant acceptance process and the various other stakeholders involved in the project. With one such property being considered for an art installation in the East End, a review of that property as it is located in the historic district will need to be conducted.

The NACC voted to request an extension of time on the historic property forum and the NACC would also like to request the Art Bridge/Arte Puente to come before them to provide clarification and answer specific questions based on the meeting before making a final decision on the grant and other related project matters. The NACC will be meeting again on September 19.

Rothschild also released a statement to commemorate







While she said she was a little anxious, she was overall excited for him to experience the great outdoors. "He's excited to experience the whole outdoor adventure. He wanted to pack when I signed him up," Agostini said.

Parent Candyce Young would also be sending her son, D'Lorenzo Thorpe, to an overnight camp for the first time. # Environmentally friendly representatives

nvironmental Advocates Action (EAA) has released its annual Environmental Scorecard which reports the environmental voting records of all New York State Senators on legislation found to have a positive or negative impact on New York's environment.

EAA notes that, this year, the Senate passed measures that:

- Protect streams and wetlands to ensure that wildlife has protected habitats and that all New Yorkers can have access to clean water;
- Reducing solid waste by supporting recycling programs and requiring carpet manufacturers to take their products back instead of being disposed of in a landfill or burned in an incinerator;
- •Assessing the cumulative impacts of projects to reverse the awful history of environmental racism;
- •Clearing the air of toxins particularly in lowincome communities and communities of color;
- Increasing funding in the state budget for land protection, climate action, children's environmental health programs, and clean water infrastructure.

Locally, Senator James. T. Skoufis scored a 94, up one point from a,year ago. According to EAA, he had one incorrect environmental vote on a bill titled "Eco-Friendly Ending." This legislation establishes a program to allow for natural organic reduction as an alternative to cemetery burial or cremation, which are currently the two options for processing human remains after death in New York.

Skoufis voted in favor of legislation that bans use of Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) in clothing, a sensitive area for local residents who have first-hand knowledge of the "forever chemicals" that have been found in Newburgh's water supply and pose a serious threat to human health and wellbeing.

He also supported an "enhanced public participation plan" for major projects located within or adjacent to disadvantaged communities and "Green Transit," a bill that requires public transportation systems to purchase zero-emission buses and related equipment, starting in 2029.

All of these measures show a critical level of environmental awareness.

# Terrible memories of polio

n the mid-twentieth century, polio was a scourge and everyone knew someone who was affected by the disease. In my elementary school class, one child "vanished" one day, absent from class and then taken off to a special hospital after the virus attacked him. He never returned - an indication that his life, and his

family's life, forever changed. One of my classmates lost his mother, a nurse who was caring for a polio patient and caught the dreaded disease herself. All our families were in a panic. Polio crippled an average

of 35,000 people per year and killed others. It seemed to increase in intensity in the summers. Homes of polio victims were quarantined, and sometimes travel and commerce were severely restricted in highly affected cities. Like the influenza pandemic of 1918, large gathering places such as theaters, playgrounds and pools were closed.

It was a virus that attacked all neighborhoods and demographic groups. Its full name was poliomyelitis and it inflamed nerve tissue often destroying myelin (the protective nerve covering) leaving lasting weakness. Like most viral infections, it usually began with fatigue and aches. Children were more vulnerable. That is why polio was also known as infantile paralysis. Victims could be permanently disabled, needing braces, crutches or even ventilators for the rest of their lives. In the 1940's, ventilators were full-body chambers called "iron lungs." Parents could see and gesture to their sick children only through glass windows in those submarine-like tubes. It was terrifying for everyone.

President Franklin Roosevelt, who had been debilitated himself by the polio virus, started the National Center for Infantile Paralysis in 1938. His life story includes his development of the Warm Springs Foundation after his own paralysis set in the 1920's. Warm Springs was a rehabilitation facility he developed in Georgia, and the hope it gave paralysis victims for a stronger life prompted him to establish a federal program when he was president. Here in the Hudson Valley, patients affected by polio were most often treated at the special hospital in Haverstraw, NY that had been built for orthopedic rehabilitation and still serves that purpose as the Helen Hayes Hospital after the famous American actor who endowed it. Her daughter had died of

polio at age 19.

Mothers took up the cause to raise money to find a polio cure, and The Mothers March began in 1950. All around America, porch lights came on. Just as they called us home at the end of a day of play, the lights proclaimed that our mothers were going to watch out for us in every way they could devise. Collecting money to speed the research for a cure was their plan, and The March of Dimes was begun. Many of us may remember the cardboard dime holders that the polio crusaders turned in when filled.

The breakthrough came in 1953, when University of Pittsburgh research physician Jonas Salk announced that he believed he had a polio vaccine. It had taken three years

of lab trials and then would require clinical trials. Here in Newburgh, New York, our children were part of that clinical trial. In early 1954, some of us lined up at the City Health Department (headquartered in the former Columbian Hose firehouse at 255 Broadway) for a series of trial injections. I clearly recall inching my way up the tall staircase and seeing my Dubois Street neighbor, Miss Ryan (a public health nurse) in her starched uniform setting up the injections. I was 8 years old and, like that whole line of children, super nervous. Our parents had told us we were lucky to be the first to see what would hopefully be a way to end polio. Yet, it involved needles! It involved a big public setting where we had to be

I was a Polio Pioneer and still have the registration card to prove it. Thank you to all the mothers who walked and collected dimes to support the effort to get that vaccine to us and to educate families to this day. We all believed that the work of so many in the 1950's had brought an end to the scourge of the polio virus. Yet, after so much historic success, some folks have forgotten the struggle and the results if the battle is lost.

# The Wall That Heals coming to Middletown


The Wall That Heals, a three-quarter scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial along with a mobile Education Center, is coming to Middletown on September 15-18 at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church, 90 Euclid Ave., Middletown, and will be open 24 hours a day and free to the public. The Wall That Heals honors the more than three million Americans who served in the U.S. Armed Forces in the Vietnam War, and it bears the names of the 58,281 men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice in Vietnam.

"We are pleased to host this amazing memorial not only on behalf of the veterans of the Vietnam War, but of all those who have served our country. My hope is that this event will be an opportunity of healing and education for everyone in the community," said Rev. Paul A.M. Denault, O.Carm. Pastor, Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish

"The Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund is pleased to bring The Wall That Heals mobile exhibit to Middletown to allow local veterans and their family members a chance to experience The Wall," said Jim Knotts, president and CEO of VVMF. "Hosting The Wall That Heals provides an opportunity to honor and remember all those who served and sacrificed in the Vietnam War and educate visitors on the continuing impact of the Vietnam War on America."

VVMF will work closely with each community to maintain and exceed health and safety standards as established by the appropriate federal, state and local authorities.

"Nothing is more important to VVMF than the health and well-being of our

Vietnam veterans and their families. We will work closely with the host to provide the best visitor experience while keeping the safety of our staff, volunteers and visitors at top of mind," said Knotts.

The Wall That Heals is transported from community to community in a 53-foot trailer. When parked, the trailer opens with exhibits built into its sides, allowing it to serve as a mobile Education Center telling the story of the Vietnam War, The Wall and the divisive era in American history.

The three-quarter scale Wall replica

is 375 feet in length and stands 7.5 feet high at its tallest point. Visitors will experience The Wall rising above them as they walk towards the apex, a key feature of the design of The Wall in D.C. Visitors are able to do name rubbings of individual service members' names on The Wall.

The mobile Education Center exhibit includes: digital photo displays of "Hometown Heroes," service members whose names are on The Wall that list their home of record within the area of a visit; digital photo displays of Vietnam veterans from the local area honored through VVMF's In Memory program which honors veterans who returned home from Vietnam and later died as a result of their service; video displays that teach about the history and impact of The Wall; educational exhibits told through items representative of those left at The Wall in D.C.; a replica of the In Memory plaque; a map of Vietnam and a chronological overview of the Vietnam War. The exhibits tell the story of the Vietnam War, The Wall and the era surrounding the conflict, and are designed to put American experiences in Vietnam in a historical and cultural context.

The 2022 national The Wall That Heals tour is generously sponsored by USAA. Through a partnership with the Truckload Carriers Association (TCA), the trucking industry and Blue Beacon, the exhibit is able to travel across the country. Also, many thanks to lead sponsor Orange and Rockland Utilities.

Since its debut in 1996, the exhibit has been on display in nearly 700 U.S. communities, in addition to an April 1999 tour of the Four Provinces of Ireland and a visit to Canada in 2005. The Wall That Heals is a program of VVMF, the nonprofit organization that built the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, D.C. in 1982. The Wall That Heals is the only traveling exhibit affiliated with The Wall in Washington, D.C. and includes the largest Wall replica that travels the country. Two VVMF staff members lead volunteers on site, educate visitors and students and ensure the reflective atmosphere of The Wall. More information can be found at: thewallthatheals.org.

Following the completion of these proceedings on or before December 31, 2022 and after 12:00:00 AM on January 1, 2023, the Pine Bush Fire District will permanently provide fire protection services to the same properties within the Town of Crawford and to the same properties within the Town of Shawangunk at present. In this regard, it is noted that for many years the properties of the New Prospect Fire Protection District have been provided fire protection services by the Pine Bush Fire District pursuant to annual contracts between the Town of Shawangunk and the Pine Bush Fire District.

(d) The territorial boundaries of the proposed consolidated governmental entity, to wit: the Pine Bush Fire District are as follows: portions of the Town of Crawford as described on Schedule "A" attached hereto and portions of the Town of Shawangunk as described on Schedule "B" attached hereto.

(e) The type and class of the proposed consolidated governmental entity, to wit: the Pine Bush Fire District will remain a district corporation and political subdivision of the State of New York.

(f) The governmental organization of the proposed consolidated governmental entity, to wit: the Pine Bush Fire District insofar as concerns elected and appointed positions will he same as they existed prior to the consolidation, except that in all annual and special elections or referenda held in the Pine Bush Fire District after January 1, 2023, the qualified residents of the properties previously within the New Prospect Fire Protection District will be electors of the consolidated Pine Bush Fire District. Elected positions will remain five (5) fire commissioners, each with a staggered five (5) year term. 
